



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
























Scores by Class Position

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
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



We published our initial LBC restoration article about a 1973 MGB GT V8 a few months ago. In that article we discussed and described one side of the restoration equation, the car, but did not spend much time on the other side, the people. I believe this is the more important part of the equation. The Dinnerman's have a passionate history with MG's.

David's MG mania began while he attended a semester at the London School of Economics in 1974, David took his first ride in the then new MGB GT V8. David and a friend looked at a blue V8 MGB with teal interior, they rode it around for hours in the middle of the night and David fell head over heels for the little V8 MGB GT. He returned to the US married Ilana, served his country in the Army but never lost his passion for MGs.



In the early 1980s, David began collecting MGs including; a 1957 MGA, a 1962 B, a 1973 BGT, an orange 1971 Midget, and finally the car Matt is going to restore a 1973 MGB GT V8. David also joined every MG car club he could find whether in the US or in the British Isles.



David felt the available literature on MGs was severely lacking and began planning to author his own book on this LBC. Can you imagine trying to author a book on an original Atom or a Commodore 64 computer? David wanted to give enthusiasts a complete and comprehensive reference for their MGs. He spent a lot of his time gathering data for his book by working with other enthusiasts to repair their cars, as well as helping other MG owners that reluctantly gave up on their LBCs.

David's memory of that midnight ride in the V8 MG weighed heavily in his dreams and he finally decided that he should find a V8







MGB and bring it to the US. This decision really begins the saga that David and Matt now share because this is when Matt's 1973 MGB



GT V8 was brought into the picture.

David, now resolved to get a V8 MGB GT and went to England to find one. Once in England he met with Murray Scott Nelson restoration garage about 2 available V8 MGBs. The garage had two available, one in Teal and one in Aconite, David easily chose the Teal one. After negotiating with the shop for the necessary alterations to make his new V8 MG meet American safety standards (such as upgrading the brake system and replacing doors), David spent some time looking around England at other V8 MGB GTs and ended up at the MG factory in Abingdon. David could not resist stopping by the Magic Midget, a pub in Abingdon, to share a pint of ale with MG

factory workers. Once there he noticed it was closed. So he walked down the street and noticed a gentleman cleaning his 1979 MGB GT. He struck up a conversation with the owner and they became instant friends. That was Trevor Jones, who installed the interior in the V8 David was purchasing. Eventually, Trevor became an honorary uncle to David's three sons, Etan, Trevor and Matt. Clive, one of the

> shop owners, organized publicity of the first V8 to display his shops work. Ilana and David stayed with Trevor and Jackie for a few days with the plan to have Clive fix the overheating. David and Trevor showed their cars at the Brand's Hatch Raceway show. Then drove the car to Heathrow airport and left it with Trevor for shipment. David and Ilana returned to the US to pick up the car.

David was well on his way to having the first MGB GT V8 imported in the United States. But now is when it gets interest-

ing,

Along with the safety modifications Murray Scott Nelson garage was tasked to fix the overheating before it was shipped to the US. They didn't fix it in time, but Trevor went ahead and sent it on the ship from Liverpool to Dundalk, MD.





The timing of the MGs importation was critical because Sen. Warner of VA's office called to say that the grey market loophole was closing due to changing legislation in California.



It was imported in David's mother's name because under the grey market law, a person could import 1 car in a lifetime that did not meet EPA standards. They were afraid that if they had to deport the car (for whatever reason; failing to meet standards), they would try to bring it in again under dad's name. Customs ultimately changed the law to then require people to put down a deposit (100% the value of the car) to allow it into the country with the requirement that it be up to American safety standards within 60-90 days.

The fun of having a right hand drive car in America began early. David drove home from Dundalk to Woodbridge, VA with his nephew Tony, who was 7 or 8

years old at the time, in the passenger seat. David gave Tony a 57 MGA steering wheel and Tony would play the steering wheel game, pretending to drive on the American driver's side of the car, to surprise people on highway 95. They would repeat this game as they drove the car around to different shows.

David received an invite to the launch of the MG F at Dulles airport where he was asked to juxtapose his car next to the new MG F in 1986. David undertook to dress up the MGB for this event so he had it painted, but wasn't returned until 3 days before the show. David

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worked on it for 2 days straight, but couldn't complete it in time for the show. He was very disappointed in missing this event.

Whiskey Glazed Flat Iron Steaks and



Grilled Potatoes

The flat iron steak is the second most tender cut of beef, after the petit filet mignon. It comes from the top blade of the chuck. You may see a flat iron steak incorrectly labeled if it has a thick muscle that runs down the center of the steak. A true flat iron is cut horizontally just above and below that tough muscle (rather than vertically through it) so the muscle can be discarded and all that is left is very flavorful and tender beef. If you don't see these steaks in your grocery store, ask your butcher to cut them for you. In most cases, the butcher would be happy to comply and it is well worth it.

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup whiskey, such as Jack Daniels
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 4 cloves garlic, smashed
- Four 8-ounce flat iron steaks or filet mignon steaks

- 1 1/2 pounds Yukon gold potatoes
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives
- 1 teaspoon white wine vinegar

Directions

Preheat a grill on medium-high heat. Whisk together the whiskey, brown sugar, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt and 1 teaspoon pepper until the sugar and salt are dissolved. Stir in 2 tablespoons of the oil and the garlic. Add the steaks, turn a few times to coat with the marinade and let stand at room temperature for 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, quarter each potato lengthwise to form wedges and put in a medium pot. Cover with cold water to cover by 1-inch and add salt until the water tastes like sea water. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, reduce the heat to medium and simmer until tender (but not falling apart), about 15 minutes. Drain well. Toss with 1 tablespoon olive oil.

Remove the steaks from the marinade and pat dry with paper towels. Pour the marinade into a small pot and bring to a boil. Boil for 2 to 3 minutes until slightly reduced, making sure the sugar does not burn, to make a glaze and sauce for the steak.

Grill the steaks until an internal temperature on an instant-read thermometer reads about 130 degrees F, 3 to 4 minutes per side, brushing with the boiled marinade several times in the last few minutes of grilling time. (If you are cooking the filet mignon steaks, you will need to increase this time to 8 to 10 minutes per side to account for the thicker cut). Transfer to a large plate to rest for 5 to 10 minutes. While the steaks grill, add the potatoes to the grill and grill until wellmarked and crispy, turning to grill all sides, about 5 minutes total. Transfer the potato wedges to a bowl.

Toss the grilled potatoes with the remaining 1 tablespoon oil, chives, vinegar and salt and pepper to taste. Remove the garlic cloves from the remaining glaze and serve drizzled over the steaks with the potatoes on the side.

Sweet-and-Spicy Baby Back Ribs



Ingredients

- 3 1 -pound racks baby back pork ribs
- Juice of 1 lemon
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 1/2 cup lager-style beer
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 8 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- 1 tablespoon chipotle chile powder
- 1 cup Thai sweet chile sauce (such as Mae Ploy)
- 2 tablespoons packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup rice vinegar (not seasoned)

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F. Put the ribs meat-side down on a cutting board. Insert a paring knife between the membrane and the bones on one end of each rack, then loosen the membrane and pull it off. Rub the ribs with the lemon juice and sprinkle evenly with 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Place the ribs bone-side down in a large roasting pan, then add the beer. Cover tightly with foil, transfer to

the oven and roast until the meat pulls away from the bone, about 1 hour.

Meanwhile, make the sauce: Melt the butter in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat; add the garlic and cook, stirring occasionally, until slightly golden, about 2 minutes. Add the chile powder and cook 1 minute. Stir in the chile sauce, brown sugar, vinegar and 1 cup water and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to low and simmer, stirring occasionally, until the sauce is thickened and reduced by half, about 40 minutes.

Remove the ribs from the oven; increase the temperature to 400 degrees F. Uncover the pan; carefully pour out the cooking liquid. Stir 1/4 cup cooking liquid into the sauce, then discard the rest of the liquid. Generously brush the ribs with the sauce. Return the pan to the oven and continue roasting, uncovered, until the ribs are golden brown and tender, about 35 minutes.

Transfer the ribs to a cutting board and slice, then return to the roasting pan. Pour the remaining sauce on top and toss.



The Ribs would go well with a Michelada (A Mexican Beer Cocktail)

Ingredients:

- 1 lime
- 1 bottle / can Mexican beer
- Kosher salt
- Worcestershire sauce
- Hot sauce (Tapatio or Tabasco work)

Instructions:

Rim a chilled beer mug or pint glass with salt. Squeeze in the lime juice and add a pinch of salt. Add two dashes each of Worcestershire sauce and hot sauce. Pour in cold beer. (Be careful when pouring as the salt may cause it to foam more.)

And on the Lighter Side: BLTs With Blue Cheese-Buffalo Aioli





Make the sandwiches: Lay 4 slices of bread on a cutting board. Spread 2 to 3 teaspoons or so of the aioli on each slice, then top each with 8 halfpieces of bacon, a few slices of tomato, some red onion and a single piece of lettuce. Top each with another slice of bread. Slice the sandwiches in half.

Prohibition Lemonade

Ingredients: 1oz. Whiskey 3oz. Lemonade Club Soda to top off Lemon for garnish

Directions:

Pour ingredients into a tall glass with ice. Stir. Garnish with lemon, if desired and enjoy.

Ingredients

For the aioli:

- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup crumbled blue cheese
- 2 tablespoons hot sauce (such as Frank's or Pete's)
- 1 small clove garlic, grated
- Freshly ground pepper For the sandwiches:
- 8 1/2 -inch-thick slices country-style white, wheat or rye bread, lightly toasted
- 16 strips good-quality thick-cut bacon, cooked and cut in half
- 3 large tomatoes, thinly sliced
- 1 red onion, thinly sliced
- 4 leaves Bibb lettuce

Directions

Make the aioli: Combine the mayonnaise, blue cheese, hot sauce, garlic, and pepper to taste in a small bowl and stir well.



MG continues its Relaunch with GS SUV

MG launched its first-ever SUV at the London Motor Show. The GS was designed and engineered at the brand's Longbridge factory in Birmingham, UK, and will join the rapidly swelling crowd of high-riding hatchbacks designed with the city in mind.

Just like Mazda and Nissan, MG has tried to draw buyers in with a sporty, rugged looking exterior. Whereas most concept cars have their styling toned right down when it comes time to reach production, the GS looks remarkably similar to the CS Concept MG showed in 2013.

Yes, the production car's wheels are a bit smaller, but the rest of the package is true to what we were promised three years ago. To our eyes, that makes for a pretty handsome package, although there's not much going on at the front to set it apart from the cheap-and-cheerful MG3 launched at the same time as the CS Concept.

Before we go any further, it's worth asking what MG actually is these days. Founded in 1924, Morris Garages was known for creating



quintessentially British roadsters, many of which have found favor with modern car enthusiasts keen to get their hands dirty with home restoration projects.

Having fallen upon hard times during the tumultuous reign of British Leyland, the storied marque is now owned by SAIC, which is responsible for cars like the

SAIC Maxus MPV G10 and Roewe G10. SA-IC is aiming to use the MG brand to lead its global charge, and cars like the MG6, MG3

and GS will be on the front line in that assault.

In the United Kingdom, the GS will powered by a turbocharged 1.5-liter petrol engine, and can be combined with a manual gearbox or, for the first time in the new MG lineup, a dual clutch automatic gearbox.



Further details will be released in June,

when the car undergoes its full UK launch. For now, prospective buyers are able to register their interest on the MG website.

MG Magna

The MG F-type Magna is a six-cylinder-engined car that was produced by MG from October 1931 to 1932. It was also known as the 12/70.

Looking for a car to fill the gap between the M-Type Midget and the 18/80, MG turned to another of the engines that had become available from William Morris's acquisition of Wolseley. This was the 1271 cc 6-cylinder version of the overhead camshaft engine used in the 1929 MG M type Midget and previously seen in the 1930 Wolseley Hornet and had dummy side covers to disguise its origins.

With its sloping radiator and long bonnet the F-Type is an attractive car capable of reaching 70 mph (110 km/h). 188 of the cars were supplied in chassis form to outside coachbuilders such as Abbey, Jarvis, Stiles and Windover.




