# The Best Thing to Hit Atlantic City Since Salt Water Taffy!

In only a few months, MG enthusiasts from across the continent as well as from overseas will arrive in Atlantic City, NJ to participate in MG International – Atlantic City 2021! gatherings and try to improve on them in with an "encore performance." We use an event planner (Sandy Graves of Helms-Briscoe) for selecting a city and hotel complex



It seems like only yesterday that we put the wraps on our Louisville meet; how can 2016 be almost five years ago?!

The Council members typically take a break for about a year before thinking about the next event (and five years seems so far away!) and post-2016 was no different. The event is always on our mind...what did we do right, what did we do wrong, what can we do to make the next event even better than before? We don't attempt to "cookie cutter" the show each time, but we do incorporate ideas and concepts that work well and are well received by the registrants at previous to use for these events. We've had Sandy onboard since we began planning MG2006 in Gatlinburg and are quite pleased with her efforts. Sandy knows our likes and needs and works with Convention and Visitors Centers as well as hotel properties in getting the best deal possible for us.

By the way, we hold a "mid-week" event as room rates are typically better for those days than during a weekend and a mid-week event also provides a weekend on either end for travel, meaning that those in the work force will usually need to take only one week of vacation in order to attend. Our requirements for 2021 were that the event be east of the Mississippi and in a region that the Council had not been to before. It was Sandy's task to find cities that had a hotel (or a hotel complex similar to Louisville) that had about 1000 rooms with availability during peak va cation/travel times, as well as having a reasonable "rack rate including all fees and taxes." We started in 2017 with about a dozen cities/properties and narrowed that down to three (Baltimore, the Poconos, and Atlantic City). We went to each of these areas on a whirlwind site-visit that fall. When we returned home, and after "sleeping on it" for a bit, we took a vote and Atlantic City came out on top. The Council has been working hard over the past three+ years and we believe that we have a program for MG International Atlantic City 2021 that will have something for everyone. Historic tours of Philadelphia along with visits to the Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum and both Cape May and nearby Smithville await our registrants. (I would be remiss if I did not mention Lucy the Elephant in nearby Margate!)

A Word About Salt Water Taffy- While the origins of Salt Water Taffy remain a mystery, one thing is for certain. No one did more to promote this popular confection than Joseph Fralinger. A former glassblower and fish merchant, Joseph returned from Philadelphia to his Atlantic City roots in the mid-1880s. After taking a job with a bricklayer, he earned enough money to open a small concession on the Atlantic City Boardwalk from which he sold fruit, soda, and the latest summer sensation, "lemonade." By 1884, Joseph was approached to take over a taffy stand on Applegate Pier. He agreed and began to perfect his own recipe for Salt Water Taffy, introducing his first batch of molasses taffy in 1885. Throughout the years, he developed a number of new flavors, eventually offering Atlantic City's largest selection with 25. As Fralinger's grew to six locations, he decided that Salt Water Taffy should return home with resort visitors. Using experience from his fish merchant days, he packed one pound oyster boxes with Salt Water Taffy, making it the first "Atlantic City Souvenir." The one-pound box still remains the most popular souvenir over 125 years later. And by 1899 Salt Water Taffy had become a household word across Americal.





#### THE MINI CLUBMAN THROUGH THE YEARS

The Mini Clubman was first conceived in 1969 as a replacement for the Wolsely and Riley upmarket variants of the Classic 1959 Mini. It featured a longer, squarer nose and better interior quality than its older sister and in 1972 the 1275 GT model and Clubman Estate replaced the Mini Cooper S model and Mini Traveler respectively.



Although safer, had better engine access and was better equipped than the Classic Mini, it was

more expensive to produce and sell and has worse fuel consumption as it was less aerodynamic. As a result sales were fewer than



expected and it was replaced by a completely new design, the Mini Metro, in 1980, after 583,000 had been produced. The Classic Mini remained on sale until 2000, when it too was replaced. There was no Clubman in the new MINI model range until 2007 when an entirely new model, with the signature twin opening "barn doors" of the previous Mini Traveler was introduced.



The new "first generation" MINI Clubman was sold between 2007 and 2014 and was distinguished by its single rear "suicide" door on the passenger side (USA models). It did not sell well in the UK, MINI's largest market, because the rear door opened into traffic, cars driving on the left there of course. So in 2015 the Clubman was redesigned to be larger to accommodate three adults in the rear, with two larger rear side passenger doors and a more upmarket interior than other contemporary MINIs. It is still on sale in this design and still with its rear "barn doors".


#### The MG Tractor

MG produced a tractor from 1948 to 1964. They made two different models. A four wheel (M4) and a three-wheel version (M3) used for row crops. A Morris 4-cylinder side valve engine powered the original tractors models. Later models used BMC diesel engines.

Actually Morris Motors produced a tractor called the Nuffield Universal not MG. The name came from William Richard Morris being ennobled as the 1st Viscount of Nuffield in 1938. Nuffield was a village in Oxfordshire where he lived. His business experience started at the age of 15 as a bicycle seller and repairer. At 16 he started his own bicycle business in his parents garage when his employer refused him a pay increase. He started working on motorcycles in 1901 and produced a motorcycle called the Morris Motor Cycle. William then started selling and repairing cars and later owned a car dealership called the Oxford Motor Garage which he later changed the name to The Morris Garage. In 1912 he designed a car called the "bullnose" using bought-in components that included engines and axles from the US.

Most of William Morris' success was due to his ability to acquire car companies that were failing, manufacturing companies of motorcar parts, and joint ventures with other companies to supply parts for his car production. William Morris was the English equivalent to Henry Ford. He was the first car producer in England to use the assembly line. William Morris died August 22 1963.

To me this article feels a little like an April Fools ioke. I ran across this information on an Internet search. I had never heard of this tractor. Cheers and Safety Fast - Mike

#### The Jensen Healey Story

When the British Motor Company (BMC) decided to discontinue building the Austin-Healey 3000 in 1967, Donald Healey was not ready to get completely out of the car business. He was anxious to build another sports car with his name attached. The Jensen Healey was the result of a collaboration between Kjell (pronounced Shell) Qvale and Donald Healey.

Kjell Qvale was a very successful business man who owned a California-based import car distribution network. In the late 1960's, the Jensen Motor Company was in bankruptcy so Mr. Qvale bought 80% of the company to ensure production of this new car.



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The car used a newly developed Lotus twin cam 16valve 4 cylinder engine that produced 140 BHP. The transmission was a Chrysler four speed unit from the Sunbeam Rapier. The suspension was from Vauxhall. So, as you can see, parts and components from several different manufacturers were placed into service all surrounded by a sporty two seat body produced by Jensen.

The MK1 Jensen Healey was produced in 1972 and 1973 at a volume of 3,356. The MK2 version incorporating a number of changes was produced in 1974 and 1975 at a volume of 6.438.

By all measures this car should have been a resounding success. It had the Healey name on the car and a Lotus engine under the bonnet. So, what happened? The new Lotus twin cam engine turned out to be both a blessing and a curse. A blessing because this all aluminum power plant was dynamic and innovative for the time. A curse because the first production year cars had severe problems with rubber timing belts breaking and killing the engine. There were numerous oil leaks that exceeded those normally experienced with British cars (i.e. really bad oil leaks). The Dellorto carburetors were unable to withstand gravity pressure when the car was parked on a hill. The result was gasoline being dumped into the oil and numerous bearing failures resulted. Stromberg carburetor equipped cars had a tendency for some internal plastic parts to break and gasoline would overflow the unit. This resulted in the gas being deposited on a hot exhaust manifold and many disastrous car fires. All of this resulted in numerous warranty claims, unhappy customers and a significant drop in profitability. The damage was done. Potential customers were made aware of the problems through the media, word of mouth, automotive magazines, car club discussions and sales dropped off significantly.

The MK2 version of the car addressed many of the initial complaints. The timing belt was strengthened, oil leaks (mostly) resolved and a Getrag five speed transmission installed in the final 700 cars for better drivability. But it was too late to save the long term future of the car and the company. In 1975, with over 1,000 unsold Jensen Healey's in stock, Qvale decided that the Jensen Company was insolvent and ended production of the car.

Today, the surviving Jensen Healey's are starting to gain the respect they so deserve. The cars are a joy to drive. Most, if not all, of the initial problems have been resolved and solutions found to the reliability issues. If you can find a nice example, go for it. You will have a rare part of British automotive history and a car that provides a classic and unique driving experience. (*Pictures are of Garry Jeffries' car*)



# Air Conditioning your MG (Part II) by Andy Preston

These are follow up questions from Tom Doyle regarding my article in last months Octagon.

1. Where did you buy the kit and what parts did it contain?

I bought the kit from RetroAir (Classic Auto Air) and it contained all the parts required for the complete installation. The radiator was extra. All parts can be sourced separately from other vendors such as Vintage Air or you could have a Hot Rod shop install one for you.

#### 2. How much did it cost?

Total cost of the AC kit plus aluminum cross flow radiator was 2050 (2014).

#### 3. How long did it take to install?

About 3 weeks off and on, approx. 100 man hours (I'm not as fast as Ant Amstead)!

4. Did it require any special tools?

I only had to buy a couple of step drill bits to drill the holes in the firewall.

5. What is the performance of the system?

You get cold air at 40°F from the outlets on a hot day. It does not cool you down like a modern AC due to hot air infiltrating the car.

6. Does it impact performance?

Yes, but only noticeable climbing steep grades. On really hot days you might have to turn it off in stop and go traffic if the engine gets too hot.

#### 7. Does it require servicing?

I had 2 AC hoses leak when first installed which were replaced by RetroAir. Since then it's been trouble free. I expect some loss of refrigerant over time which will need recharging.

#### 8. What are the advantages/disadvantages?

Advantages are a cooler car and more comfortable driving on hot days. Disadvantages are slight loss of power and a little more cluttered engine compartment and under dash making access to some areas more difficult.

#### 9. Would you recommend this system to other MGB owners?

That really depends on how much you drive your car on long journeys and in hot weather. If you only drive your MG on short weekend drives I probably wouldn't bother, but if you drive cross country and on long drives I'd say it's a must have and worth the money.

#### 10. Would you do it again or install it in another car?

Yes I would, in fact I'd love to install AC in my MGA Coupe but presently I'm waiting for Dan Shockey to install AC in his Coupe and will be pleased to help him once Covid is over.
