The 3rd Annual MGOB Seafood Run was held Sunday, October 5^{th.}, and we ended up back at Charly's on Sue Creek located at 2015 Turkey Point Road, Essex, MD 21221. The weather was fantastic, and we took over their outside on their covered deck and spilled out onto the patio. 58 members and their dates said they would be attending the event, and with a few no-shows, this took us to a total of 53 MGOB members at Charly's.

The MG Car Club Washington, D.C. Centre had their annual show at a new location. The 29th Annual Hunt Country Classic was held at the Great Meadow, 5089 Old Tavern Road, The Plains, VA, on Sunday, October 12. I was planning on attending, but it was misting and foggy in the morning so I passed on driving down to Northern Virginia. However, I saw photos on the MGCCWDCC Facebook page, and the event still took place despite the weather. I even spotted Ned Sheilds and his MGB on the show field dodging rain drops. It looks like we will need to get a report from Ned about the new location.

TRAC (Triumphs Around the Chesapeake) held their Annual Fall Foliage Poker Run on Saturday, October 18th, starting at the US-1 & MD Route 23 and running the back roads of Harford County, MD and Lancaster County, PA with stops at a couple of farms offering cider, vegetables and cards. Chris Horant and his team did a wonderful job of mapping out this year's event. I am going guess that there were about 30 cars taking part in the Run.

The Poker Run finished at the Hickory Lodge in Hickory, MD which had a separate building for us to get food & drink, while everyone was being scored. This event is the second leg of the Lord Baltimore Cup with the MGs of Baltimore's *Get the 'Dust-Off' Rally* being the first leg. The new winner will be announced at the 37th Annual Get the "Dust-Off" Rallye, scheduled for Sunday May 3rd, 2026, more information to follow.










Exhausting Walmart

What would the world be without Walmart? Mr. Sam and the folks down at Bentonville have created perhaps the most essential American retailer. Oh sure, we've made fun of them and the videos and photos of let's say some of their most unique shoppers have amused/shocked us. But even those in the upper-income brackets have come over to the Wally-world side. Good thing for those folks that they can now get their shopping delivered directly to their Mercedes, so they don't have to associate with humble masses.

Personally, I love going to the store. I look at the shoppers, and I see America. I find today's stores cleaner, more modern and with more selections than other stores. Where else can I go and get a Halloween pumpkin, a Thanksgiving turkey, a Christmas wreath and tires all in the same trip.

Oh yes, tires are what we're here to talk about. I knew CJ's "B" tires were getting a little long for wear. Since the car is always garaged they looked great with no cracks and plenty of tread. Checking the date code, I found they were celebrating their 12th birthday. No matter how much tread and lack of sidewall wear, I can tell you from racing that the rubber on these tires had seen better days. Old tires, unlike old guys, get hard. Hard tires have no grip, which is why racers change tires so often.

When it comes to things for my cars, I always put the best parts on that are available; so, it was a little weird when the advice from my advisor (Tuck) was to go cheap? The theory is that the

expense for a 50,000-mile tire when the car may get 50,000 miles in its entire life does not compute. The theory also makes since in that what makes a tire last 50,000 miles is that the compound is hard. (And will get harder with time) With a light car like an MG a softer tire is preferred. Now if you ask Tuck about tire specs, you'll get more information than most can comprehend (or need) so I've provided a short table of things you should look for in a tire. Basically, get a speed rated tire with a softness rating less than 500.



Now back to the story lead. I did an internet tire search using my 15-inch tire size and additionally my < 500 "Treadwear" specification. You guessed it, Walmart came up with a match. Now I have never heard of the manufacture, but I read the specs and for that price I couldn't pass on it. (MGOB cheap guy specification also met). I ordered the tires delivered to my local store and setup an install appointment; the internet can be very useful at times (Except for all that social crap).

Here's where Mr. Sam would be proud... I pulled into the shop bay and not one, but 4 guys started working on and admiring the B. Any other shop work stopped. I even got an extra laugh as the youngest of the crew tried to find the

MG in the computer and asked the others who makes MG. He proceeded to walk around the rear of the car to look for some type of emblem. All he could see on the B was an embedded MGOB grill badge. The old guy in the crew correctly told him that an MG was made by MG. The crew was extra gentle with the nice wheels on the B and did true road balancing. When I looked at the tires before mounting, they had virtually the same tread pattern as the expensive performance tires they were replacing and the date code indicated they were only 3 months old!

Tucks Tire Tips -

Rim

Wire 4.5" Width Rim Dia 14" Tire Size 165/80 Rostlye 5.0" Width Rim Dia 14" Tire Size 185/70 Mag 5.5" Width Rim Dia 15" Tire Size185/65

If you put a wide tire on a skinny rim, it will create sidewall bulge and poor handling. Skinny tire on wide rim narrow sidewall not recommended. **Get it right or at least close.**

Speed Rating

H = Recommended stiffer sidewall. Don't go (S or T) rating V= Stiffer still but ride quality will suffer

Traction: Preferer AA or A

Temp: Always go for A

Treadwear: < 450, I got < 500 from Walmart

Generally, a lower treadwear combined with AA or A traction means good grip.

It's hard to find Summer Performance tires. It's a marketing thing almost everything now is All Weather.
